The Road Department has the following items on the Board of Commissioners agenda for the weekly meeting on April 23, 2024. The following is a brief description of the items.

#### Bid Opening - Seven Mile Lane Left Turn Lane Paving Project

This is a scheduled bid opening for the above referenced project.

Resolution & Order 2024-134 – Delegation of Authority, Paving Services on Santiam Terrace Road This is a Resolution and Order to approve a delegation of authority to the Roadmaster for purchasing paving services for the ride quality overlay on Santiam Terrace Road from Wildish Construction Co. in the amount of \$68,452.

#### Resolution & Order 2024-137 – Local Agency Certification Program IGA

This is a Resolution and Order to approve a Local Agency Certification Program Agreement between Linn County and the State of Oregon, Department of Transportation. As a Certified Local Public Agency (LPA), this agreement authorizes the County to deliver federal-aid projects through the Certification Program.

#### Resolution 2024-143 – Authorize Road Closure, Main Street in Scio (County Road 611)

This is a Resolution to authorize the closure of a portion of Main Street in Scio for the Linn County Lamb and Wool Fair parade and related activities. The dates requested for the closure are May 17 and 18 at the times indicated.

# REPORT TO COMMISSIONERS Update for March 2023

#### Detention

Benton: 5 youth were held for 52 total of days of care, 1 females and 4 males.

Total Admissions to Detention = 6 Average Daily Population = 1.68 youth Average Length of Stay = 8.67 days

Linn:

28 youth were held for 269 total of days of care, 7 females and 20 males.

Total Admissions to Detention = 30 Average Daily Population = 8.68 youth Average Length of Stay = 8.97 days

Lincoln 4 youth were held for 69 total days of care, 1 females and 3 males

Total Admissions to Detention = 4 Average Daily Population = 2.23 youth Average Length of Stay = 17.25 days

Time for Change Program: 0

#### Probation

The Juvenile Department received 61 referrals during the month of March 2023.

Of the 61 referrals, 14 represent dependency, 15 status and 30 criminal.

There are currently 190 youth in the Probation Unit either on probation or pending court with 36 of those being assessed high-risk.

There are currently 63 youth under the Community Programs Unit serving on informal probation and the Intervention Specialist is currently serving 80 youth. 77 of those youth are from the community with no involvement with law enforcement.

#### Work Crew


Tier 1-3 youth completed 43.25 hours of community service in 4 project days. In 2022 7 youth completed 116.50 hours of service during the same time period.






