Linn County accepting Youth Wage Grant applications

ALBANY — Linn County employers who hire first-time employees ages 14 to 19 this summer, can qualify for a \$4 per hour stipend provided by a Youth Wage Grant.

The program, in its 16th year. It is supported by Video Lottery funds designated for economic development and was initiated by the Linn County Board of Commissioners.

To qualify, businesses must hire eligible employees between May 1 and September 30. The employee must be legal to work in the United States and a resident of Linn County.

In 2019, the program included 20 businesses and 44 young people and the county provided a \$2 per hour stipend that totaled \$28,217.

Qualifying businesses must employ 35 or fewer employees and the young people must be first-time employees, who have not previously worked for the individual business.

Maximum reimbursement is \$6,000 per employer and businesses can hire up to three qualifying young people at a time.

This application will provide basic information needed to review your grant request. To the extent permitted by O.R.S. 192.502(3), all details will be held in strict confidence.

GRANT QUALIFICATIONS

Linn County, using economic development funds, will reimburse Linn County small business employers (35 employees or less) that employ first-time employment youth <u>hired on or after May 1, 2021</u> at a rate of \$4.00/hr for hours worked. The program period runs from May 1 through September 30, 2021. Maximum employer <u>reimbursement</u> per new **employee** will be up to \$2,000; Maximum reimbursement per **employer** can't exceed \$6,000. Each youth employed must be a Linn County resident, at least 14 years of age, but not older than 19. <u>Youth 14 through 17 must be hired with a Bureau of Labor & Industries permit, include a copy with this application. The employer will have to certify they are in compliance with all Federal and State youth labor laws (State Board of Labor & Industry {BOLI} rules and regulations). The maximum any one employer may hire at any one time is three (3) qualifying youth.</u>

An employer may <u>obtain an application</u> at <u>www.co.linn.or.us</u> or by calling the Linn County Board of Commissioners' Office at (541) 967-3825. The deadline to submit an application is <u>September 3</u>, <u>2021</u>. The application must identify the first-time employment youth by date hired, name, age, home address and phone number. The employer must have on file a properly completed Employment Eligibility Verification Form I-9 for each youth hired showing he or she is legal to work in the United States. Once an employer application is approved, the employer will be required to sign a contract with Linn County stating the terms of the program and what will be expected of the employer to receive reimbursement.

All participating employers will have until <u>November 5, 2021 to submit a request for reimbursement</u> of payroll costs at a rate of \$4.00/hr up to \$2,000 per new hire youth for work performed during the program period. Documentation must include payroll stubs indicating the participating youth by name, home address, number of hours worked, and pay per hour. Reimbursement requests must cover a pay period of at least 30 days or may be made at the time a youth is terminated. Payment will occur within 30 days of receipt of the request for reimbursement.

LINN COUNTY SMALL BUSINESS FIRST-TIME EMPLOYMENT YOUTH WAGE GRANT PROGRAM

Linn County Board of Commissioners announce its summer Small Business First-Time Employment Youth Wage Grant Program which will assist County small businesses (35 employees or less) in hiring first-time employment youth; a youth who has not previously worked for the employer. The Commissioners understand that the current Oregon minimum wage is making it difficult for Linn County small businesses to employ entry-level youth who are then unable to gain valuable work experience.

The County will reimburse Linn County small businesses (35 employees or less) who employ first-time employment youth \$4/hr for hours worked from May 1 through September 30, 2021. An employer can only hire three (3) qualifying youth at any given time. Maximum reimbursement per employer is \$6,000 with a maximum of \$2,000 per new hire youth. Each youth has to be legal to work in the U.S., a Linn County resident and at least 14 years of age but not older than 19. Youth 14 through 17 must be hired with a Bureau of Labor & Industries permit. The employer has to certify they are in compliance with all Federal and State youth labor laws (State Board of Labor & Industry [BOLI] rules and regulations).

An employer may **file an application** with the Linn County Board of Commissioners, 300 4th Ave SW (PO Box 100), Albany OR 97321, from **May 1 through September 3, 2021.** The application must identify the first-time employment youth by date hired, name, age, home address, phone number and have a properly completed Employment Eligibility Verification Form I-9 for each youth showing he or she is legal to work in the United States. Once an employer application is approved, the employer will be required to sign a contract with Linn County stating the terms of the program and what will be expected of the employer to receive reimbursement at a rate of \$4/hr for hiring a first-time employment youth.

All participating employers will have until November 5, 2021 to submit a request for reimbursement of payroll costs. Documentation must include payroll stubs indicating the participating youth by name, home address, number of hours worked, and pay per hour. All reimbursement requests that include youth 14 through 17 must include a copy of the employer's Bureau of Labor & Industries permit. Reimbursement requests must cover a pay period of at least 30 days or for the entire program period or may be made at the time a youth is terminated.
