

Do I Need a Stormwater Permit?

Impervious Area Worksheet


Impervious Area is the area of the completed development that will not absorb or infiltrate rainfall or drainage. **It is the built area of the site, including all hardscape.**

Areas included in an impervious area calculation:

- Building roof area footprint(s) (including porches and eves)
- Outbuilding roof area footprint(s) (including porches and eves)
- All paved/concrete or compacted aggregate areas, including:
 - Driveways
 - o Parking areas
 - Patios
 - Traditionally installed tile, modular paving or brick surfaces
 - Pathways and trails
 - Fire Department turnarounds
- Access roads
- Swimming pools
- Tennis/basketball courts, etc.
- All surfaces designed to shed water

Use the following table to estimate the impervious area for your site. This is the total new or replaced impervious surface area of the proposed development.
