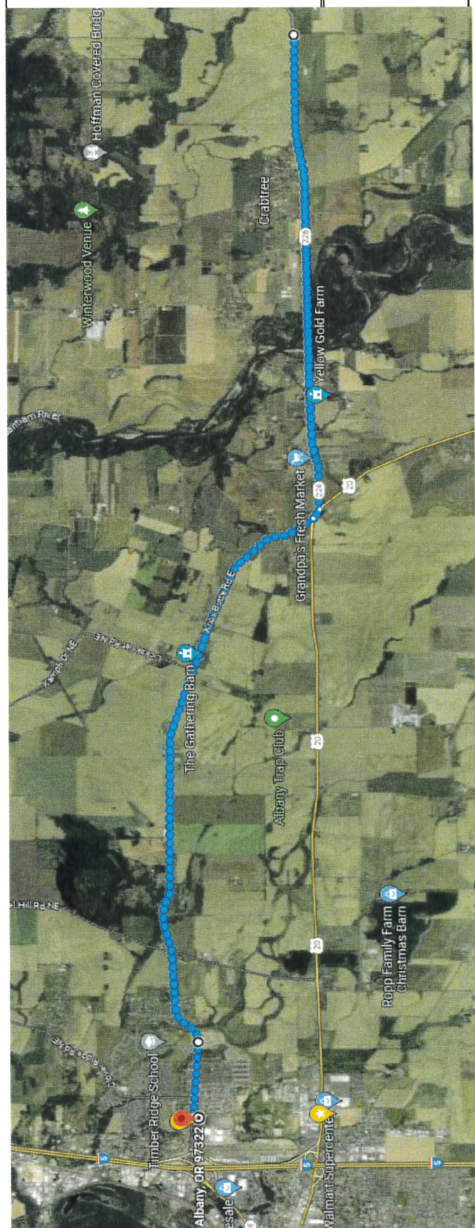

3. 1-82 CAV conducts one annual foot march for Soldiers to earn their Norwegian Foot March Badge.

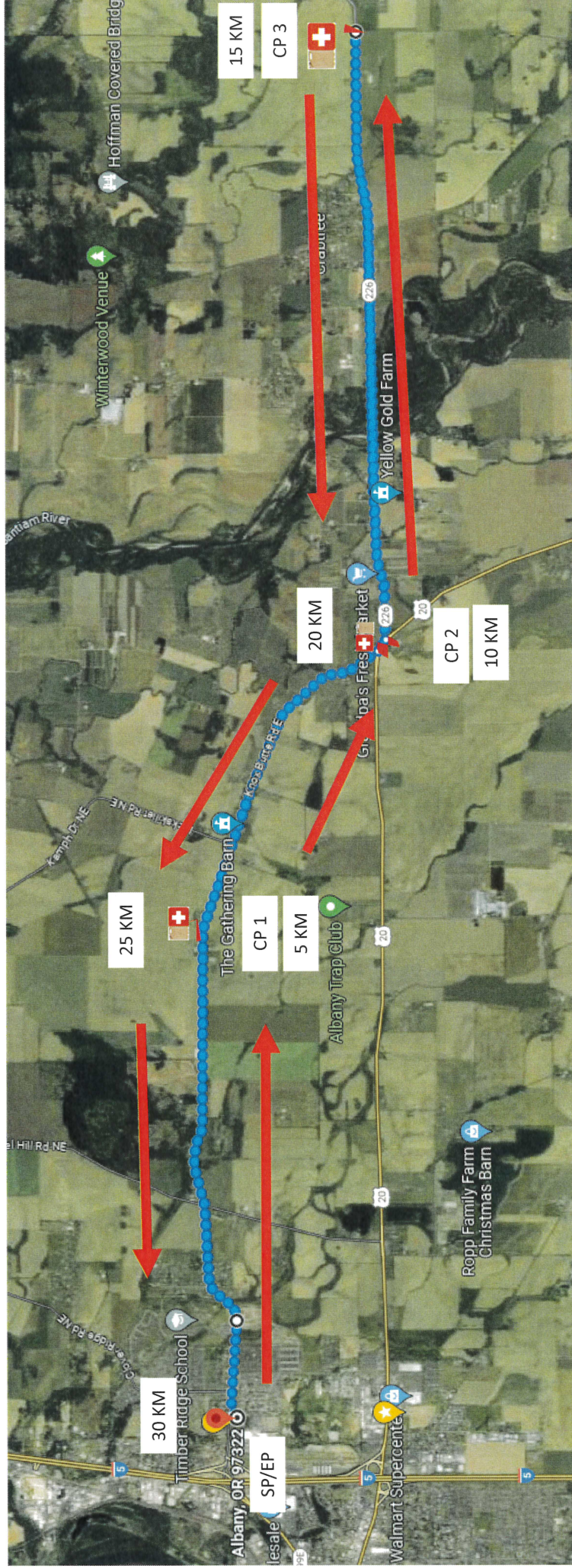
Concept of Operations:
Phase I Preparation: This phase begins with an IPR with interested parties and support personnel for synchronization, and supporting medical units and ends with participants have checked in. This phase includes DRAW development and approval, route recon, resource planning and allocation, and train-up. Vital to this phase is the gathering of all equipment, supporting personnel, event personnel and confirmation of the route. This phase ends when all participating individuals are accounted for prior to starting.

Phase II Execution: Phase II begins when the first Soldier crosses the start/finish line at 04 0500 NOV 2023. Participants will have no more than 5 hours to complete the 18.6 Mile (30 KM) Foot March. Road Guards will then ensure participants safely continue along the approved route. Participants will continue along the route taking guidance from fellow Service Members w/reflective belts pre-positioned at identified friction points. Participants will turn around at the 9.3 mile point and move back to the Albany Armory. This phase ends when the last participants are cleared from the route.

Phase III AAR: This phase begins when ALL personnel have cleared the course NLT 04 1000 NOV 2023. Vital to this phase is the consolidation of equipment, personnel on 04 NOV 2023 and conduction of the AAR and submission of Foot March results to Norwegian Embassy on 05 NOV 2023. This phase ends with the consolidation of all AAR comments

Phase IV Recognition: This phase begins with the submission of results to the Norwegian Embassy on 05 NOV 2023 and ends with the receivable, and distribution of Norwegian Foot March Badges and certificates for Cadets who met the requirements

EVAC Treatment Plan

1. GSA Van with two medics will follow last person in ruck
2. On site medics and CLS trained Soldier evaluates injured casualty and moved to the nearest checkpoint
3. Determine treatment option, URGENT, PRIORITY, ROUTINE
4. Medic will decide if casualty can be treated on site or transported to hospital
5. Additional medical support will be requested if needed
6. Primary/Emergency Plan: Call 911
7. Secondary/Non life-threatening: Use GSA Van to transport to Samaritan Albany General Hospital

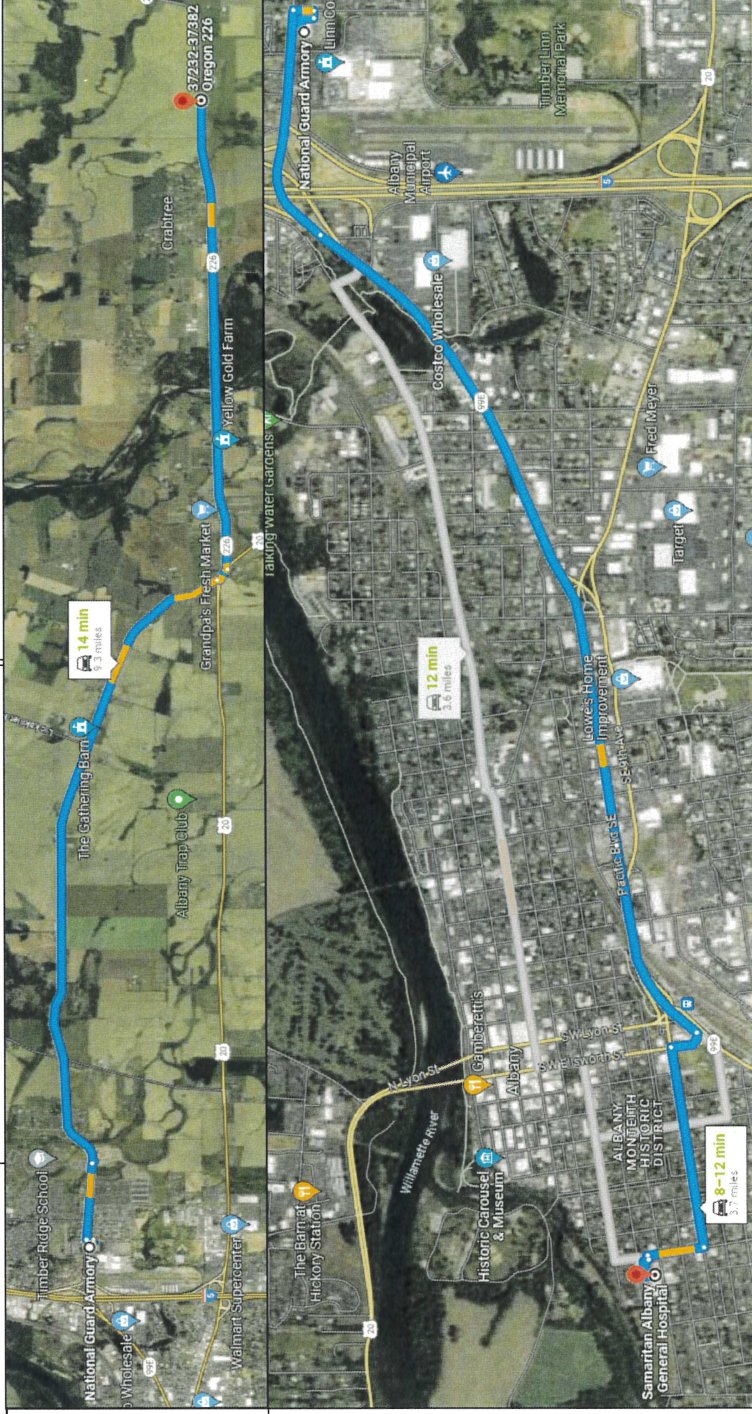
